## Friends Scholarship Awards Program

For the 2023-2024 Academic Year

#### Purpose:

The purpose of the Friends Scholarship Awards is to provide college scholarship awards to students or graduate students who have shown a career interest in the following areas: Music, Agriculture, Service, Education or Library Science, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Manufacturing), Special Education, or Education or School Administration at a Master's level. Students are invited to apply for the scholarship award according to their area of interest.

#### Awards:

Up to five undergraduate and one graduate scholarship awards are available in amounts of \$500 annually. Awards are for one academic year, but recipients may re-apply for each subsequent academic year they are in school. All Scholarship awards will be paid directly to the student's account at the university designated.

#### **Eligibility:**

Applicants must be a full-time undergraduate student attending an accredited college or accredited vocational school. Graduate students must be attending accredited Master's level program.

- 1. Applicants must be majoring in one of the following fields:
  - A. The **Leanna Roberts Music Scholarship:** For students pursuing a career in Music or Music Education.
  - B. The **Phil Wise Agricultural Science & Sustainability Scholarship:** For those pursuing a career in Agricultural Sciences, Environmental, or related fields.
  - C. The **Jim Smith Service Scholarship:** For students with a demonstrated heart for service which could include social work, medicine, nursing, counseling, etc.
  - D. The **Gwen Tetrick Teaching Scholarship:** For students pursuing a degree in Education or Library Science.
  - E. The **Evelyn Coverdale Special Education Scholarship:** For students pursuing a career in the area of Special Education teaching, Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy or Speech/Language Pathology, School Psychology, etc.

- F. The **Everett and Gerry Latham Leadership Award:** For Master's level students pursuing service as School Administrators or a Master's in Education in the subject area of teaching.
- G. The **Way Forward Scholarship**: For students pursuing education in STEM-based programs (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Manufacturing).
- 2. Applicants must have been accepted into their area of study by the time the award is received.

The **Friends Scholarship Awards** (**FSA**) are awarded without regard to race, gender, religion, age, national origin, or sexual orientation. **FSA** will not award scholarships to applicants who are not qualified and reserve the right not to award a scholarship in a given year.

### Selection Criteria:

- 1. Demonstrated or expressed interest in one of the six areas of scholarship.
- 2. Two completed student essays.
- 3. Two recommendations that include at least one from an active member of a meeting in Western Yearly Meeting and at least one from a non-relative such as a former teacher, administrator, counsellor, employer, etc.
- 4. Academic standing (minimum required cumulative GPA of 3.0)

## **Application Requirements:**

To be considered for a **Friends Scholarship Award**, applicants must complete an application and return it by April 30, 2023. The application must include:

- 1. A completed application form. Only completed application forms will be considered.
- 2. Two recommendations with at least one from an active member of a meeting in Western Yearly Meeting and at least one from a non-relative. Applicant will give the appropriate Recommendation Form to each person, who will complete and return form electronically or by mail.
- 3. An official High School transcript or an official College transcript for the last two years, including GPA.
- 4. Responses (250-400 words each) answering two of the following four questions:

- A. Please describe what inspires you to choose the career path you are pursuing.
- B. Who is your role model and why?
- C. Is there an accomplishment or realization that has brought a new understanding of yourself?
- D. What values are most important to you?

**Note**: All Application Requirements (1-4, on the preceding page) must be completed and submitted before the application will be considered.

### **Submission of Application Form:**

<u>Electronic submission</u>: The application form and two essay question responses, and transcripts should be sent as a pdf file to: nobles.friends.scholarships@gmail.com between January 15 and April 30, 2023.

<u>Mail submission</u>: Completed application forms and packets must be post-marked by April 30, 2023 and can be mailed to:

The applicant's high school and/or college transcript can be submitted electronically or mailed to the address above.

Recommendations should be submitted by the author as PDF files (with the name of the applicant as part of the file name, such as "Recommendation for Student's Name") electronically or mailed directly from the author to the address above. **Scholarship Awards Day:** All applicants will be notified no later than June 1, 2023. Awarded applicants are invited to attend Meeting for Worship at Noblesville Friends in June to receive their award and share their stories and plans.

**Distribution of Award Funds:** Scholarship funds will be sent directly to the bursar's office of the universities or vocational schools where students are enrolled. Prior to distribution, each student needs to provide their student ID number and proof of enrollment for the 2023-2024 academic year.
